

CSH YEAR 4 OBJECTIVES

Objective 1-1: By December 2011, provide professional development, technical assistance, and/or resources to a minimum of 30 schools on Coordinated School Health committees and the School Health Index.

Objective 1-2: By October 1, 2011, professional development will be provided to at least 80 District Health Coordinators to assist them in supporting the implementation of CSH programs and policies in the schools of their district.

Objective 1-3: By February 2012, at least two resources on physical activity will be provided to schools on physical activity clubs and intramurals.

Objective 1-4: By December 2011, professional development will be provided to a minimum of 100 teachers on the newly implemented Practical Living/Career Studies Program Review.

Objective 1-5: By February 29, 2012, the 24/7 Tobacco Free Schools Collaborative will help at least 10 schools implement 24/7 tobacco free school campuses.

Objective 1-6: By February 29, 2012, collaborate with a minimum of five partners to promote CSHP and PANT.

Objective 1-7: By the end of Year 4, increase the number of high school student organizations from 19 to 40 involved in their school's physical activity, nutrition and tobacco environments through the use of the Students Taking Charge Program.

Objective 2-1: By February 28, 2012, provide Family Resource and Youth Services Center (FRYSC) coordinators with at least two resources to assist them in addressing the CSH goal of their work plan

Objective 2-2: By the end of Year 4, collaborate with the HIV Prevention Initiative to provide on-going professional development, technical assistance and resources to seven targeted schools within four school districts on implementing CSHPs
